Perfect Tense

 $\begin{array}{ccc} & \text{Singular} & \text{Plural} \\ 1^{\text{st}} & -\overline{\textbf{i}} \mbox{ (I)} & -\text{imus} \mbox{ (we)} \\ 2^{\text{nd}} & -\text{ist}\overline{\textbf{i}} \mbox{ (you)} & -\text{istis} \mbox{ (you)} \\ 3^{\text{rd}} & -\text{it} \mbox{ (he)} & -\text{erunt/-}\overline{\textbf{ere}} \mbox{ (they)} \end{array}$

Future Perfect Tense

Singular Plural

1st -erō (I will have) -erimus (we will have)
2nd -eris (youwill have)-eritis (you will have)
3rd -erit (he will have)-erint (they will have)

Pluperfect Tense

Singular Plural

1st -eram (I had) -erāmus (we had) 2nd -erās (you had) -erātis (you had) 3rd -erat (he had) -erant (they had)

To find the perfect stem of a verb, drop the $-\bar{i}$ from the third principle part.
