

## Passive Voice of the Perfect System Tenses

First, Second, Third, and Fourth Conjugation

### Perfect Tense

	Singular	Plural
1 <sup>st</sup>	_ <b>sum</b> ( <i>I</i> )	_ <b>sumus</b> ( <i>we</i> )
2 <sup>nd</sup>	_ <b>es</b> ( <i>you</i> )	_ <b>estis</b> ( <i>you</i> )
3 <sup>rd</sup>	_ <b>est</b> ( <i>he</i> )	_ <b>sunt</b> ( <i>they</i> )

### Future Perfect Tense

	Singular	Plural
1 <sup>st</sup>	_ <b>erō</b> ( <i>I will have</i> )	_ <b>erimus</b> ( <i>we will have</i> )
2 <sup>nd</sup>	_ <b>eris</b> ( <i>you will have</i> )	_ <b>eritis</b> ( <i>you will have</i> )
3 <sup>rd</sup>	_ <b>erit</b> ( <i>he will have</i> )	_ <b>erunt</b> ( <i>they will have</i> )

### Pluperfect Tense

	Singular	Plural
1 <sup>st</sup>	_ <b>eram</b> ( <i>I had</i> )	_ <b>erāmus</b> ( <i>we had</i> )
2 <sup>nd</sup>	_ <b>erās</b> ( <i>you had</i> )	_ <b>erātis</b> ( <i>you had</i> )
3 <sup>rd</sup>	_ <b>erat</b> ( <i>he had</i> )	_ <b>erant</b> ( <i>they had</i> )

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To find the perfect passive participle stem of a verb, drop the **-um** from the fourth principle part.

Any participle must agree with the subject in number, gender, and case.
