

### Subjunctive Mood of the Perfect System Tenses

First, Second, Third, and Fourth Conjugation

#### Perfect Tense

	Singular	Plural
1 <sup>st</sup>	<b>-erim</b> ( <i>I</i> )	<b>-erimus</b> ( <i>we</i> )
2 <sup>nd</sup>	<b>-eris</b> ( <i>you</i> )	<b>-eritis</b> ( <i>you</i> )
3 <sup>rd</sup>	<b>-erit</b> ( <i>he</i> )	<b>-erint</b> ( <i>they</i> )

#### Pluperfect Tense

	Singular	Plural
1 <sup>st</sup>	<b>-issem</b> ( <i>I had</i> )	<b>-issemus</b> ( <i>we had</i> )
2 <sup>nd</sup>	<b>-isses</b> ( <i>you had</i> )	<b>-issetis</b> ( <i>you had</i> )
3 <sup>rd</sup>	<b>-isset</b> ( <i>he had</i> )	<b>-issent</b> ( <i>they had</i> )

To find the subjunctive mood of the active perfect system tenses, add the endings to the 3<sup>rd</sup> principal part.

To find the subjunctive mood of the passive perfect system tenses, use the 4<sup>th</sup> principal part with the verb **esse** in the subjunctive mood.
